Contractors In Non-Traditional Roles

- § **As the US military begins recovering from a decade of active combat, contractors are now filling the void in executing foreign policy**
- § **DI is conducting aerial operations in hostile/remote/austere locations**
 - § Counter narco-terrorism
 - § All weather – day/night operations
 - § Supporting US and Allied Gov't, Military, Civilian Agencies
 - § Illicit Crop Surveillance, Crop Eradication, Interdiction, Mission Verification and Analysis

§ Aero-Medical Evacuation

§ Providing 24/7 support across Iraq

§ Secure VIP Transport

§ With 72-hour notice,
flew 1st Non-NGO aircraft into Libya

§ Dynamic Tasking

§ Deployed to Iraq with 90 days notice

§ 14 aircraft and 250 people

§ Ability to Self-Deploy
